

1.1 A bill for an act  
1.2 relating to education finance and policy; providing for school closures and other  
1.3 amendments due to COVID-19; clarifying the calculation of certain school aids  
1.4 formulas due to COVID-19; making forecast adjustments to funding for general  
1.5 education, education excellence, teachers, special education, facilities, fund transfers  
1.6 and accounting, nutrition and libraries, early childhood, and community education  
1.7 and lifelong learning; amending Laws 2019, First Special Session chapter 11,  
1.8 article 1, section 25, subdivisions 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 9; article 2, section 33, subdivisions  
1.9 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 16; article 3, section 23, subdivision 3; article 4, section 11,  
1.10 subdivisions 2, 3, 4, 5; article 6, section 7, subdivisions 2, 3, 6; article 7, section  
1.11 1, subdivisions 2, 3, 4; article 8, section 13, subdivisions 5, 6, 14; article 9, section  
1.12 3, subdivisions 2, 8.

1.13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.14 **ARTICLE 1**  
1.15 **SCHOOL CLOSURES DUE TO COVID-19**

1.16 Section 1. **TRUANCY.**

1.17 Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 260A.02, subdivision 3, a student's absence,  
1.18 without valid excuse, during the distance learning period from March 1 through May 4, or  
1.19 any extension of the distance learning period, does not bring the student within the definition  
1.20 of a continuing truant.

1.21 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment and  
1.22 expires June 30, 2020.

1.23 Sec. 2. **PROBATIONARY TEACHERS.**

1.24 For the 2019-2020 school year only, for purposes of Minnesota Statutes, sections  
1.25 122A.40, subdivision 5, paragraph (e), and 122A.41, subdivision 2, paragraph (d), the

2.1 minimum number of days of teacher service that a probationary teacher must complete  
2.2 equals the difference between 120 days and the number of scheduled instructional days that  
2.3 were canceled for COVID-19-related reasons.

2.4 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment and  
2.5 expires June 30, 2020.

2.6 **Sec. 3. INSTRUCTION TO COMMISSIONER; FEDERAL EDUCATION**  
2.7 **STABILIZATION FUND APPLICATION.**

2.8 In applying for education stabilization fund grants authorized under the federal  
2.9 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, the Department of Education must  
2.10 prioritize distribution and expenditure of funds that enables a school to comply with the  
2.11 governor's Executive Order 20-19 and any future executive order on kindergarten through  
2.12 grade 12 education that relates to the infectious disease known as COVID-19, as well as  
2.13 the corresponding Department of Education guidance related to the COVID-19 pandemic,  
2.14 including employee compensation.

2.15 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment and  
2.16 expires June 30, 2020.

2.17 **ARTICLE 2**

2.18 **FORMULA ADJUSTMENTS**

2.19 **Section 1. SCHOOL AID FORMULAS ADJUSTED.**

2.20 Subdivision 1. **Special education.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, fiscal year  
2.21 2020 expenditures for employees and contracted services that would have been eligible for  
2.22 state special education aid under Minnesota Statutes, section 125A.76, and for special  
2.23 education tuition billing under Minnesota Statutes, sections 125A.11 and 127A.47, in the  
2.24 absence of school closures due to COVID-19 must be included as eligible expenditures for  
2.25 the calculation of state special education aid and special education tuition billing.

2.26 Subd. 2. **School meals.** (a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, for school meals  
2.27 served beginning on or after March 18, 2020, the commissioner of education may adjust  
2.28 the appropriations remaining under Laws 2019, First Special Session chapter 11, article 7,  
2.29 section 1, subdivisions 2, 3, and 4, as specified in paragraph (b).

2.30 (b) On June 30, 2020, the commissioner must subtract the amount actually paid to  
2.31 participants for the 2019-2020 school year under subdivisions 2, 3, and 4, through March  
2.32 17, 2020, from the total appropriations for each program. The commissioner must then

3.1 allocate the remaining funds under each appropriation to participants in the summer food  
3.2 service program on a per meal basis for meals served on or after March 18, 2020, and before  
3.3 July 1, 2020.

3.4 Subd. 3. **Career and technical aid.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, for fiscal  
3.5 years 2020 and 2021, the commissioner of education may recalculate career and technical  
3.6 revenue for school districts, cooperatives, and charter schools to ensure that the total statewide  
3.7 career and technical revenue does not fall below the amount estimated for fiscal years 2020  
3.8 and 2021 based on the February 2020 forecast. For expenses incurred on or after March 18,  
3.9 2020, the commissioner may recalculate school district, cooperatives, and charter school  
3.10 amounts based on any other mechanism that allows for the full amount of this appropriation  
3.11 to be equitably paid to school districts, cooperatives, and charter schools. These amounts  
3.12 must be prorated at the end of each year if career and technical revenue were to exceed the  
3.13 February 2020 forecast estimate of this revenue for these fiscal years.

3.14 Subd. 4. **Nonpublic pupil transportation aid.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary,  
3.15 the commissioner of education may adjust the fiscal year 2020 pupil transportation  
3.16 expenditures used to determine nonpublic pupil transportation aid for fiscal year 2022 based  
3.17 on any mechanism that allows for the full amount of the state total fiscal year 2020  
3.18 expenditure estimated in the February 2020 forecast to be equitably allocated among school  
3.19 districts.

3.20 Subd. 5. **Interdistrict desegregation or integration transportation**  
3.21 grants. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the commissioner of education may adjust  
3.22 the fiscal year 2020 pupil transportation expenditures used to determine interdistrict  
3.23 desegregation and integration aid for fiscal year 2021 based on any mechanism that allows  
3.24 for the full amount of the state total fiscal year 2020 expenditure estimated in the February  
3.25 2020 forecast to be equitably allocated among school districts.

3.26 Subd. 6. **Adult basic education aid.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, for the  
3.27 2020-2021 school year only, the commissioner of education may recalculate adult basic  
3.28 education aid to ensure that the total aid does not fall below the amount estimated for the  
3.29 2020-2021 school year based on the February 2020 forecast. The commissioner may  
3.30 recalculate contact hour rate or otherwise adjust the formula so that the full amount of this  
3.31 appropriation to be equitably paid to aid recipients. These amounts must be prorated at the  
3.32 end of the year if adult basic education aid were to exceed the February 2020 forecast  
3.33 estimate of this aid.

4.1 Subd. 7. **School employees; ensuring state revenue.** Notwithstanding any law to the  
4.2 contrary, for purposes of state aid formulas under subdivisions 1 and 3, the commissioner  
4.3 of education may include in any counts and costs of essential personnel the services provided  
4.4 by individuals who were essential personnel prior to March 13, 2020, for the purpose of  
4.5 ensuring state aid payments to school districts, cooperative units, and charter schools are  
4.6 consistent with the February 2020 forecast.

4.7 Subd. 8. **Report.** The commissioner of education must notify school districts and charter  
4.8 schools of these formula changes as soon as practicable. The commissioner must issue a  
4.9 report by January 15, 2021, to the chairs and the ranking minority members of the legislative  
4.10 committees having jurisdiction over kindergarten through grade 12 education matters  
4.11 describing the formula changes and the distributional impact on school districts and charter  
4.12 schools.

4.13 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.

### 4.14 **ARTICLE 3**

#### 4.15 **STATE AGENCY COVID-19 EMERGENCY POWERS**

4.16 Section 1. **COMMISSIONER OF EDUCATION AND PROFESSIONAL EDUCATOR**  
4.17 **LICENSING AND STANDARDS BOARD COVID-19 EMERGENCY POWERS.**

4.18 (a) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 120B.30, for the 2019-2020 school year  
4.19 only, the commissioner of education is granted authority and must waive the state  
4.20 requirements on statewide assessments, including requirements allowing students to take a  
4.21 college entrance exam in school on a regular school day. The commissioner must waive  
4.22 any state accountability and reporting requirements linked to the statewide assessments.  
4.23 The commissioner must distribute any savings attributable to this paragraph equitably among  
4.24 schools for purposes of complying with the governor's Executive Order 20-19 and the  
4.25 corresponding Department of Education guidance related to the COVID-19 pandemic,  
4.26 including employee compensation.

4.27 (b) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 122A.183, Minnesota Rules, part  
4.28 8710.0313, or any other law to the contrary, the Professional Educator Licensing and  
4.29 Standards Board must issue a one-year conditional Tier 3 license to an applicant that is  
4.30 otherwise qualified under Minnesota Statutes, section 122A.183, but was unable to complete  
4.31 the required licensure exams under Minnesota Statutes, section 122A.185, because of a  
4.32 COVID-19-related disruption. As a condition of renewing the Tier 3 license, the applicant  
4.33 must pass the required licensure exams under Minnesota Statutes, section 122A.185. The

5.1 term of the renewed Tier 3 license under this section must be two years. The board must  
 5.2 waive the licensure renewal fee.

5.3 (c) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Professional Educator Licensing and  
 5.4 Standards Board must extend by six months any calendar year 2020 deadline for completion  
 5.5 of license renewal requirements for licenses under their jurisdiction.

5.6 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** Paragraph (a) of this section expires June 30, 2020. Paragraph  
 5.7 (b) of this section expires October 31, 2020.

5.9 (a) A court must not construe anything in this article as creating a right of action for a  
 5.10 student, parent, teacher license applicant, or any other individual or entity to enforce any  
 5.11 provisions of this article.

5.12 (b) By December 15, 2020, the Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board  
 5.13 must report on all conditional licenses issued under section 1, paragraph (b), to the chairs  
 5.14 and the ranking minority members of the committees in the house of representatives and  
 5.15 the senate with jurisdiction over kindergarten through grade 12 education policy and finance.
